He has also made a contribution to the growth of the Indian economy and the industry as well as the scientific development of India through his association as head of industry-related bodies such as Bombay Industries Association, Pharmaceutical &

Allied Manufacturers & Distributors Association Ltd., and Aerosol Promotion Council of India. ## 22<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary Literary Awards and Scholarship Function

## **Priyadarshni honours five Literateurs**

At a glittering function held on March 23, 2006 at the Walchand Hirachand Hall of the Indian Merchants' Chamber, Priyadarshni Academy presented literary awards to five leading figures in the Marathi, Hindi, Sindhi, and Gujarati languages; appreciation mementos to an IT educationist and a senior municipal official; and scholarships to 67 college and school students. The programme was presided over by Mr. Jayantrao Patil, Minister for Finance and Planning, Government of Maharashtra. Mr. Keshub Mahindra, leading industrialist and Chairman of Mahindra & Mahindra Ltd., was the Chief Guest.

In his address, Mr. Patil said that he "has never seen such continuity of work as related to society, as is done by riyadarshni Academy in bringing achievers from different aspects of life and from various parts of the world together and making us admire them".

Speaking about Mr.Rajendrakumar Vale, an important citizen who received an appreciation memento later in the evening, Mr. Patil said, "governments, including municipal administration, which have a key role to play, have to manage the cities better". For that, "we need personalities like Mr. Vale, who is an honest official and who has made commendable contributions to cleaning up the environment."

Mr. Patil presented the Abheraj Hirachand Baldota Scholarship to Ms. Kruti Kapadia, second year student of electronics and telecommunications at Vidyavardhini College of Engineering and Technology in Navi Mumbai.

All the five awards were presented by Mr. Keshub Mahindra and every one of the awardees responded after receiving their

respective award which consisted of a cheque for Rs.25,000 each and a Trophy.

Dr. Jitendra Bhatia bagged the Shri Kisharam Lekhraj Rupani Memorial Hindi Literary Award for his book *Agale Andhere Tak* and for his overall contribution to literature.

Ms. Kavita Mahajan received the Priyadarshni Academy's Marathi Literary Award for her first novel *Br,* a touching exposition of the status of women in our tribal society.

Dr. Arjan Sikayal received the Priyadarshni Academy's Sindhi Literary Award for his body of work in the Sindhi language. Dr. Sikayal is 87 years old and is an Ayurvedic Physician by profession.

Two literary figures received the Gujarati literary awards. Dr. Naresh Ved received Priyadarshni Academy's Gujarati Literary Award for his body of work in Gujarati and Mr. Chandulal Selarka received Priyadarshni Academy Chairman's Special Award for his contribution to literature.

Mrs. Aruna Katara, Executive Chair, I²IT, Pune, and Managing Trustee, Hope Foundation, and Mr. Rajendrakumar Vale, Assistant Municipal Commissioner, received Appreciation Mementoes for their exemplary service. Mrs. Katara dedicated the appreciation memento to her institute and gave credit for her achievements to the guidance she received from Dr. Vijay Bhatkar, Chairman of Priyadarshni Academy's Vedic Research Centre and Founder Chancellor, India International Multiversity.

The response of Mr. Vale, a senior municipal official, was that

"Mumbai has one and a half crore population in a small land mass which is not easy to manage. But, with determination, we can continue to bring about small changes". He added that whatever little he had done "had been with the help of NGOs" and that "this public recognition will go a long way in motivating him and his team."

As many as 67 scholarships were given to students doing courses in engineering, IT, architecture, B.Ed. and medical sciences. A majority of the scholarships carried an amount of Rs.10,000. Among the recipients were a number of the disadvantaged who were merited.

Mr. Niranjan Hiranandani, Co-Chairman of Priyadarshni Academy, a builder extraordinaire and the man responsible for changing the Mumbai skyline, said that "the Perestroika (change) is that India today is known all over the world whereas it was considered a backward country not long ago. It is known as the knowledge center. We are grateful for the progress we have made in various fields. It is because of the respect, integrity, honesty, and other values that we have built for which we are recognized in the world community, and because of the leadership we have created in different disciplines."

While addressing the audience, industrialist Mr. Keshub Mahindra said "education is the most powerful tool and the key to cultural, social and economic progress. But, we have pitiful infrastructure. Various amenities, quality of life, shortage of water, the health sector, all need to be improved." He called upon people like Mr. Hiranandani to take the lead in improving infrastructure. "The government can't do it alone", he added,

"It needs to partner with the business community to make progress a reality.".

The program was sponsored by Shri Narendrakumar A. Baldota, CMD of the Baldota Group, an emerging corporate giant in India, with multiple businesses in the fields of iron ore mining, exploration of gold and diamonds, industrial and medical gases, wind power generation, and banking, and now entering the steel business.

Mr. Mahesh Thakkar, General Secretary, Priyadarshni Academy, proposed a vote of thanks.






