

The recipient of **Smt. Chandaben Mohanbhai Patel** Gujarati Literary Award for this year was **Mr. Kundan**




Sindhi Literary Award:

This year's *Laxmi-Nari Pohani* Sindhi literary Award of Priyadarshni Academy went to *Dr. Jagdish Lachhani*. Dr. Jagdish Lachhani is an eminent writer, with thirty five books to his credit, on a wide variety of literary forms in Sindhi, Hindi and English. Jagdish's writings are noted for lucidity of language and clarity of expression. His subjects of special interest are literary criticism, tele plays and children's literature. His notable contribution to Sindhi literature is 'SAHITYA-JEEPARAKH' (Evaluation of literature), a Book which makes a very healthy critical assessment of literature. He was honored with two awards for this outstanding work. Dr. Lachhani' has rendered a yeoman service to the cause of Sindhi education as well.



He held several prestigious positions such as President of Indian Newspaper Society, Member of Press Council of India, President of Indian Languages Newspapers Association, to name a few.

Mr. Vyas was awarded the **DAG HAMMERSKJOLD** Fellowship of the United Nations in the year 1976. Mr. Vyas has covered the Indo-Pakistan war in 1971 as a war correspondent. He contributes regularly to the Indo-American Business Times published from Washington.

He has accompanied the Prime Minister and Finance Minister on their visits to several countries to cover bilateral talks and international conferences.







Felicitation of Vaswani:

Mr. Ghansham Vaswani was felicitated for his outstanding contribution to Sindhi music. Gifted with a melodious voice, he came as a discovery from the Ghazal Maestro Jagjit Singh. He has many popular film songs to his credit, one of them being the popular song "Itni Shakti Hamein Dena Data" from the film Ankush. As a composer, he completed a ghazal album for Shri Jagjit Singh, titled "FORGET ME NOT" with songs sung bythe ghazal Maestro. He has also composed for Sindhi films, dance ballets, and audio CDs, including a few Sindhi sufi albums. Ghansham has been regularly performing live not only in India but in all parts of the globe from Japan to the USA. He is a very versatile artiste singing Ghazals, Bhajans, Sufi and popular music with equal ease.

Over 250 scholarships to financially needy and deserving students pursuing different fields of study including to those from the National School for the Blind were presented. This included 20 Neurology Foundation Scholarships introduced this year.

Mr. Javed Ahmad, while congratulating the awardees and students, spoke about the need for citizens to perform their duties apart from fighting for their rights. He emphasized the need for value-based education focusing on the themes of contemporary society, such as empowering women.

Dr. Singhal spoke about the advances in the field of neurology and efforts that are being made to enlarge the number of doctors available to serve the needs of the large populace in India. All literary awardees spoke about the need for society to respect and advance its values through communication, its literature, and its languages.

Mr. Nanik Rupani, Founder-Chairman of the Academy, came in for special praise for his vision to introduce literary awards in the languages over half a century ago when English was the language sought after, and awards in the languages were rarely heard of. The literary awards carried a trophy and a purse of Rs.25,000 each and many of the scholarships were for Rs.10,000 each.


