

28th Anniversary Global Awards



Chief Guest Shri Ghulam Nabi Azad was all praise for Mr. Rupani and the Academy's team for assembling a distinguished array of awardees and organizing an event of enormous magnitude. He added that he was fully aware of fraternity awards — scientific organizations honoring scientists, film associations honoring actors and so on — but had not come across an award function which selected people from such different countries and from such diverse disciplines. He also stressed that it was important to recognize talent and reward talent to inspire achievers to greater achievements and to have achievers serve as models for others to achieve.

The Chief Guest stated that India is doing all it can to ensure growth in all aspects of life with focus on inclusiveness. Talking about his own Ministry, he said 'the dearth of skilled manpower in under serviced areas in the healthcare sector poses the biggest challenge, hence the government is creating avenues for more recruitment. India has one of the highest infant mortality rates in the world which is an issue of grave concern. We are taking stern measures to minimize this rate.

Priyadarshni Academy Chairman Mr. Nanik Rupani, in his welcome speech expressed his gratitude to all those who had supported the Academy over the years. He visibly broke down when recalling 'today, I dearly miss my friend late Shri Vilasrao Deshmukh who was with the Academy from day one, with the very first function, and rendered invaluable services to the Academy'. A 60-second video of his association was screened. The audience observed a one-minute silence in late Deshmukh's honor. Mr. Rupani also recalled the close association with the Academy of Shri Sushilkumar Shinde and Shri Govindrao Adik.

Chairman of the Global Awards Advisory Committee Dr. Mashelkar said, 'this evening celebrates the achievements of some extraordinary individuals who have done us proud with their exemplary deeds and

lives. They have done transformational work and have done the Academy proud by accepting its awards. They have made the impossible possible, they are lighthouses in these turbulent times and choppy seas. They illuminate our paths and show us the way by serving as guide posts. By honoring them, we are honoring ourselves as an Academy."

He added that the Priyadarshni Academy Awards Committee "is the hardest I have chaired because it has set such high benchmarks by recognizing achievers like Narayana Moorthy and Sachin Tendulkar to makers of society and those who went on to become Presidents. These benchmarks are difficult to surpass, yet we have been passing those benchmarks".

Receiving the award from Shri Gulam Nabi Azad on behalf of 150,000 employees of the Birla enterprise across six continents, Mr. Kumar Mangalam Birla recalled his group's first brush with globalization when his father Late Aditya Birla ventured into foreign markets. Speaking of his own foray into global markets, he said it was due to forces of globalization and to strengthen businesses, access new markets, new technologies and raw materials and to be one step closer to the consumers. He added 'we are an MNC born in India with an Indian soul. A major percentage of our business comes from abroad and I believe that will continue to be the trend'. He concluded by saying that it had been easier to go global because 'there is respect and regard for Indian companies and entrepreneurs and I would not hesitate to say that Indian managers are amongst the best in the world in terms of intellectual capability, ability to work hard, and commit to goals. They have the ability and vision to make India a global economic superpower'.

28th Anniversary Global Awards

It is not often that one sees the mother of an awardee in the audience. Not only Mr. Kumar Mangalam Birla's mother, Mrs. Rajashree Birla, but also his wife, Mrs. Neerja Birla was in the audience to witness him receiving the award. **Mrs. Radhika Nath, daughter of Late Harish Mahindra joined** Chief Guest Shri Azad when he presented the award to Mr. Birla.

While accepting the award from Shri Dilip Walse-Patil, Chevalier Thakur Niranjan Deva-Aditya, thanked Priyadarshni Academy 'for the great honor you have bestowed on all the hard working taxpayers of the European Union of whom I am but their servant. The outstanding contribution to international development you have recognized in your award is recognition of the outstanding, significant and continuing commitment that the peoples of Europe have made to uplift the well-being of the global poor.

Even in these times of economic crisis, the European peoples have increased their contribution to feed the starving, house the homeless, hydrate the water-starved, irrigate the parched land, educate the ignorant, medicate those poor affected by AIDS, Malaria, TB and other infectious diseases.

Dr. Samir Brahmachari received the award from Shri Anil Deshmukh on behalf of "my young associates, the young students and the scientists".

Dr. Brahmachari narrated how he was able to, in five years, create a movement of open source drug discovery where more than 6000 scientists and researchers from over 100 countries participated; how he could make the tuberculosis drug through an open source so that it became affordable.

Citing that every evening 1000 people in India die of TB, he spoke of his dream to bring the number down, by the 75th birthday of this nation, to 100. He added that when he mentioned it to industrialist **Mr. Mukesh Ambani**, the latter said "I am with you and we would like to bring it down to 10 and not 100."

Dr. Brahmachari dedicated the award to those patients whose samples, blood, and clinical data he used and the doctors who worked with him which made it possible for him to make all those discoveries.

Dr. Jeanne Devos received the award from Shri Azad with **Mr. Niraj Bajaj, son of Late Ramkrishna Bajaj, and his wife Minal Bajaj joining** them. Dr. Devos received it on behalf of everyone in the National Domestic Workers Movement and considered the award recognition of their contribution to humanity. "Domestic work is one of the oldest and most important occupations

for millions of women, children and men in India, many of whom are exploited in so many different ways." She stated with pride that "we achieved dignity and a name for domestic work and workers. We have empowered lakhs of domestic workers to fight for their rights." Dr. Devos sketched the history of the movement, its struggle for years to fight for the rights of workers and their role in pushing the sexual harassment bill in the Indian Parliament in 2010 which was subsequently approved. She added that the 'cause of protection of domestic workers is gaining huge momentum globally and India too is implementing it at national and state levels'. Dr. Devos spoke of her dream of a society free of women and child workers adding that 'it is only then that there can be real freedom and equality'. She spoke of their participation in the National Advisory Commission and the Task Force of the Ministry of Labor to frame the national policy on domestic workers which 'is our landmark contribution'. She elaborated that there are thousands of action groups and lakhs of domestic workers who participate in the movement and concluded that their experience was that 'through participation change was possible. At the national level, the draft national policy for domestic workers is set to go to the Cabinet for its approval.

Dr. Jacques Rogozinski received his award from Mr. Carlos Magarinos. He started off by saying that 'only a few years ago the developed world looked upon countries in the developing world including India and Latin America as unviable. But things have changed. The developed world now recognizes that we have big potential. 'He spoke about his many years of experience with privatization and with medium and small companies and asserted that to improve their productivity, it is important to give them access to credit and technical assistance. About 80% of the world's industrial production comes from small and medium enterprises, hence ample care and protection should be provided to these sectors across the globe so that they become more competitive'.

Mr. Aditya Puri, on receiving the global award from Mr. Azad, said 'Indian banking system is one of the most stable in the world. It is profitable, well capitalized, safe and secure with a bright future. Let us not confuse the noise of a democracy in transition with the vibrancy of India. We know our problems and the solutions. We just need to work together to achieve our goals. On the other hand, a large part of the world has huge problems and are not clear on solutions. So India, cheer up, it is time for action not despair - we are on our way'.

Mr. Puri added that the Indian banking system is one of the best opportunities for financial services given the expected growth rate and the under penetration of organized finance. However, 'going forward, we need to ensure appropriate regulation given the experience of the West and needs of India.

In a developing country, banks are the main source of financial intermediation and meet the needs of businesses. But the development of India as a rich/poor country is asking the banks to fulfill the role of banks, debt market, venture capital, and government - this expectation will be difficult to meet.

We have taken a pledge to uplift 1.2 million families who are living below poverty line to above poverty line. Efforts should be imparted to input more financial resources in agriculture and small enterprises through microfinance schemes so that the person at the base of the pyramid also benefits. Ample precaution should be taken regarding the equity component of FII.

In conclusion, we need to focus on composite solutions across the economic spectrum to ensure we meet our potential for GDP growth'.

Mr. Juan Scharetti, after receiving the award from Shri Dilip Walse-Patil, said he has been focussing on increasing transparency in political affairs, providing rural housing, having the poor sector participate in the political process, supporting private subsidies for pregnant women; improving political leadership in the 20th century; and strengthening relations between emerging markets of Latin America and India by improving understanding between our societies leading people to a better life.

'It is necessary that common citizens should have knowledge about political systems as that gives them knowledge about their rights and issues. For good governance, it is important to have clean and transparent political system, like the one I have tried to create in my region in Argentina.'

On receiving the Smita Patil memorial award, noted **Bollywood star Ms. Deepika Padukone** said 'every morning when I wake up, I resolve to work much harder. I am humbled and honoured to receive such a prestigious award at such an early stage, this award gives me the belief that I am moving in the right direction'.

Chief Guest Mr. Azad released the souvenir and an e-book on Arthashastra in Farzi following which **Ms. Sharda Nandram**, Professor of Entrepreneurship, University of Applied Sciences HAN, Netherlands, who helped in coordinating the Farzi translation commended the good work Priyadarshni Academy is doing in spreading awareness about ancient Indian wisdom across international audiences.

Mr. Niranjan Hiranandani, Vice-Chairman of the Academy, shared the views expressed by a number of

leaders that 'all of us should vow to do something to help the common man' and then went on to describe his recently initiated project on developing skills for people across the population spectrum. He emphasized that he plans to develop such skills among the low end of the spectrum that will help the aged in need of tending. He proposed that in the next 5 to 10 years, 'all of us can together get two million people to be employed through such an effort and contribute to inclusiveness which has been the theme of the Academy's awards program this year'.
