

The proceedings began in a traditional and auspicious manner with Chief Guest and Maharashtra Chief Minister Shri Vilasrao Deshmukh and other leading dignitaries on the stage giving light to the ceremonial brass lamp, an ancient Indian tradition which signifies the spread of wisdom, knowledge and goodwill throughout the length and breadth of the earth.


He quickly noted, however, that "achievers like Shri Deepak Parekh, Shri Tulsi Tanti, and Shri Shashi Tharoor are indeed thinking big and achieving great results but we, as a nation, collectively, are not thinking and doing enough. We still have a lot of poverty, lack of education, and lacunae in a lot of other issues all around us although we are an advanced society and we are not able to do much about them. It is, therefore, that when we meet to honour people such as are assembled today, we need to take cues. I think we get a lot of praise for doing so little. The expectation levels of people need to go up considerably."

"We need to do so much more. There is so much opportunity in our country. In the field of aviation, if city states of Singapore and Dubai which are considerably smaller in size can attract 15 to 20 million tourists a year, why are we not able to attract anywhere near that figure? I am not giving you the larger picture as it is too complicated, but even in small, soft areas, we are not making enough difference. We can create and generate so much employment. We also need to increase our confidence levels.

"Mumbai is a city which can generate its own revenue. It only needs facilitation. It needs to create an environment to attract large investments. We need to create a platform. Maharashtra State has so many things to offer. It cannot be paralleled by any other state in our country.

India is certainly a country which cannot be ignored as people like Tulsi Tanti (jo paisa hawa se banate hai' (who creates money out of air) belong to our country."

Dr. Michael Nobel, Guest of Honour, said he was

honoured to be at the function and added that the function has seen magnificent arrangements made. "I would like to say that mankind does not live by bread alone. Once the primary need of bread, butter, and roof are satisfied, then recognition is needed to move upwards and appreciation and recognition are needed for efforts made in life. Only 700 Nobel prizes have been presented thus far. That works out to 13 awardees per year out of 6.3 billion people in the world. This clearly shows the need, therefore, for organizations such as Priyadarshni Academy to fill the gap. The Nobel prizes are given in fields that were of interest to Alfred Nobel physics, chemistry, literature, medicine, peace, etc. There is clearly a need for strong awards in other areas, notably the practical and applied sciences, humanitarian efforts and commercial development. Today, we are seeing a rich sampling. I am glad for the opportunity to be here.

Shri Nana Chudasama, Special Guest, supported Shri Rupani's request for free land from the Chief Minister for establishing a big convention centre in Mumbai.

Shri Hiranandani, Vice Chairman, Priyadarshni Academy, talked about leadership which was present in the truest meaning of the word in the achievements of all the silver jubilee awardees. He specially cited the instance of Shri Deepak Parekh who gave home loans when no other bank in the country dared to do so. Today, other financial institutions are competing with HDFC and giving home loans. That is the type of leadership our country has created. So, it is correct to say that the leadership of those who received awards today is not just leadership in the normal sense, but one that has set trends and created systems and changed paradigms for the benefit of mankind."

Following is the Text of Mr. Rupani's Address:

At the outset, I wish to express my sincere thanks to Mr Nirj Deva, Member of the European Parliament, and Mr. Hans Martin Schempp, President - International Association for Human Values, for giving me an opportunity to express my views on a subject which is close to my heart.

In today's changing business environment, companies that conduct business in an ethical, transparent and socially responsible fashion are expected to do better than their peers, and so they get rewarded by almost all stakeholders of the business community and society.

Thus, it makes a strong business case for companies to become good corporate citizens. Incorporation of ethics in business is no longer philanthropy but a business imperative. The culture of business is slowly getting evolved in a manner that minimizes environmental damages.

I firmly believe that companies with socially responsible behaviour will create better societies. This, in turn, will lead to sustainable cities, a concept gaining momentum because more than half of the world's population is living in urban areas.

Although corporate governance in India was in practice even in the ancient era, the modern saga of "business ethics" and "Corporate Social Responsibility" has gained momentum globally only after the Asian Financial Crisis in 1997. The current ongoing global financial turmoil proves

once again the importance of business ethics and good governance practices.

Global meltdown is largely due to failures in lending standards, risk management and corporate governance by the world's major lending institutions. Today's financial crisis has its roots in corporate irresponsibility and unethical practices.

The crisis goes deeper as it wasn't just that the loan seekers were at fault, but the mortgage providers and the bankers were equally at fault. People got home loans without verification of their income or assets.

'Companies today have become bigger than many economies. Companies are little republics. These are engines of efficiency and growth. If companies don't do responsible things, who is going to do?'

Well-managed CSR supports the business objectives and goals of the company and builds relationship with the key stakeholders whose opinion is valuable in such turbulent times.

Social awareness movement has raised expectations of businesses to use their massive financial and social influence to address social problems such as poverty, crime, environmental issues and lack of educational facilities. As business and commerce gained importance, business operations have become more complex. This has led to the emergence of "business ethics" as a

management discipline.

Even Kautilya (also known as Chanakya), India's most illustrious political economist of all times, around 2,400 years ago in his Arthashastra, suggested balancing of procedures and systems for avoiding malpractices.

One of Kautilya's recommendations at that time was – "The government taxes should be so low as the honey bee sitting on the flower and sucking the nectar without damaging the flower" - It should be so low as to discourage tax evasion.

We take pride in saying that Indian thoughts and philosophies have always advocated "CSR as an ingrained business value." The saints and sages in ancient India possessed nothing in the material world, but worked with the sense of mission of serving the society for the welfare of mankind. In ancient times, Indians were involved in promoting community development projects. There is an ancient saying "Helping others is punya (good), hurting others is papa (evil)". But why to gain this punya (good)? The simple answer in the Indian philosophical context is "cause-effect relationship and reincarnation".

Once upon a time, spirituality was left at the office doors; however, today spirituality is focused upon as a management tool. The number of organizations which are moving towards "spiritual" direction is increasing. Today, along with physical, emotional and intellectual elements, spirituality is also considered as the key factor for growth.

Indian religion and philosophy has always promoted spirituality at the work place. Swami Vivekananda has rightly said that the unique genius of India is that India is a spiritual country. In the ancient Indian context, corporate spirituality was supported. Work is considered as Yajna or a sacrifice. Work or karma or service purifies the mind which is an essential pre-requisite to any spiritual quest. Selfless service dedicated to God is the process of mind purification. The Travancore Maharaja used to call himself as "daasa" (servant) and ruled over his kingdom in his Lord's name. India's unique genius is spirituality and we consider life itself as a spiritual journey. Though in recent times, the West has adopted spirituality as a management tool, India has always been a spiritual country and has believed in work-life spirituality.

Moreover, Indian philosophy claims that a moral and balanced life would free us from a sense of guilt, tension, anxiety, stress and frustration. This can be assumed to be secular concepts and values. As per Bhagavad Gita, a prayerful attitude, working in the name of God without attachment to the end results and accepting the results as God's blessings would add a spiritual element to the secular values.

Indian philosophy teaches that the Change is the Ultimate Truth and one has to realize that.

Many management Gurus in the western world also teach

the same and they say "Change or Perish".

With advancement in living standards, science, technology and economy, an increasing need is being felt for a profitable but yet sustainable growth.

Rapid industrialization has created imbalances in the economy. There is a widening gap between the rich and the poor. Climatic changes and environmental pollution have resulted in depletion of resources thereby leading to an increase in the prices of basic and essential commodities.

Some analysts have said the current crisis sweeping financial markets may leave no money for investments in limiting greenhouse gas emissions. However, ignoring the threat of climate change would send the world into an economic tailspin far greater than that of the global financial meltdown. As Mahatma Gandhi said "The Earth provides enough to satisfy every man's need, but not every man's greed".

We must remember that we are all inter-connected with each other. What affects one, directly or indirectly, affects all. To state the Ultimate Truth "What you do to others, you do to yourself".

# Interiors are what lies within your body... not your house, clean and renovate those first



It was disheartening to hear a student at the Prana Yoga studio requesting for an 'extension period' to 'make up' for the sessions he would miss due to renovations starting in his apartment. "Ma'am, my interiors are being done up, so I will need a break from yoga classes

since I will have no time for 6 – 8 months till the work is done". He never returned to class after that. As renovations in apartments take much longer than expected, he had crossed the 'grace period' too. When we met him at a social function (he had time for that, even though kadias, carpenters, painters, and architects generally work from 10 AM onwards, not when he came to class at 6.30 AM), we hoped he had at least continued his practice with a private yoga instructor or on his own, for which he was pretty geared up. He said he never got back to it.

Another student coming to the Yoga class wanted to do 'make up' classes instead because she would not be able to attend all the Yoga classes, the reason being she was starting to commence Diwali cleaning. In the Yoga class, we teachers generally comprehend the word 'cleaning' as a 'shodhan kriya'.... cleansing ritual which includes the famous Kapalbhati, often seen on TV and many others like Neti, dhauti, Basti, Kunjal, etc.

The moment you take the first step to benefit from anything that enables you to think more clearly, breath more effortlessly, and move more efficiently, realize that your renovation and cleansing are at their pinnacle from the moment you take that step.

One may find it difficult to locate a book or have a teacher who gives an exhaustive study of human anatomy and the interwoven Yoga asanas, their classifications, actions and effects on joints, the circulatory systems, the endocrine system, the cardio vascular system, the nervous system, and explain the science of yoga. No single book or teacher may be able to do that... because yoga has an infinite number of details and extends itself to 84 lac postures, excluding Pranayam techniques and Shodhan Kriyas..... all of which are endlessly fascinating and potentially useful in some way or the other.

However, you as a seeker (Drashta) need to find out how you can accomplish your targets and fulfill your dreams by discovering the right blend for yourself.

Realize that no teacher is wrong, whereby you need to unlearn something you had been practicing; it is only his understanding of the original texts that may have been construed or interpreted differently. So, let the mind not get confused with different traditions and various names because all of them are pathways leading to the same destination.

Just as our experience of breath and gravity was the starting point of our life on this planet, yoga is the integration and binding of everything and anything that crosses our way. One of the greatest heart breaks we can ever have is to get to the fag end of our life and realize that we did not manifest our dream, achieve our targets and fulfill our most cherished desires. The reason for that often is because we consider our 'exteriors' as our interiors..... and blame others for our time constraint. Your time is as much personal and your very own as your body is. So use it well.

Much has been said and read about looking within, cleaning the interiors, awareness of our own inner self, feeling inner sensations, time management, and yet we give all our time and importance to what is outside.

Understand the anatomy of prioritizing v/s. procrastinating before understanding the anatomy of the body. The anatomy of the body is more unwavering than our nature, temperament and disposition.

Each one of us has wounds within us, physical and emotional inner or outer, that are pleading to be healed and time spent in following the discipline of yoga and on learning the various techniques shown to us in the ancient scriptures like 'Yogasutras of Patanjali', Hathayoga Pradipika, Gerhand Samhita will eventually help us heal those wounds, physical and emotional, external and internal. You can get the fruits only by working on the roots..... your root, your core in what will give you your fruit.

Let the inner voice within you, guide you to take the steps towards inner realms of calm. Think within. "Our field is much bigger than what we dwarf ourselves to believe" My yoga teacher would say... so, try to reach beyond with unwavering insistence to find your own truth, a truth that unites our mind, body and breath.

The moment you step from dependence to independence, you move from the first four limbs of ashtanga yoga (meaning yoga of 8 limbs or steps) namely Yama (abstentions), Niyama (observances), Asanas (Postures), Pranayam (control of vital energy) to the next four limbs, namely Pratyahar (withdrawal of senses), Dharna (concentration), Dhyana (meditation), Samadhi (eternal bliss and super-conscious state).

The magnificent language of yoga arose from the true-tolife anatomical experiments of millions of seekers and watchers of thousands of years....... and all these Drashtas shared one common anatomical, biological and chemical laboratory - the human body. Give this beautiful body its daily dose of yoga with no excuses of any kind.

"Asanas are treated of in the first place, as they form the first stage of Hathayoga. One should practice Asanas, as they make one firm, free of decease, and light of limb." Hathayoga Pradipika 1 – 19.

So, let the dirt, wounds and scars not deepen in us with procrastination and irregularity if we want to continue transforming our lives with movements of pride (asana) and breaths of glory (pranayam).

#### 'EMPOWERING WOMEN'



In modern times, 'empowering women' is an extremely difficult challenge, but it is also an essential requirement for improving their status in male-dominated societies. An aspect of empowering women is to enable them with scientific knowledge of their genetic superiority over men. Since women
