

For her versatile and stellar performances over a period of time which has earned her accolades from critics, film bodies, and millions of filmgoers around the world

6. Sir Fazle Hasan Abed KCMG, Founder & Chairperson, BRAC, Bangladesh

Award for Outstanding Contributions to Alleviation of Poverty and Empowerment of the Poor

For his lifetime achievements, through education, in alleviating poverty and empowering the poor internationally by developing their capacity to better manage their lives through BRAC, the institution

In his speech, Dada said that service alone is the main purpose of life; He added that: 1) what we



should do to others we would have them do to us; 2) we should be true to our duty; explaining that rights and duties are two sides of the same coin, that when we focus on duties, the rights due to us will follow automatically; 3) Be compassionate and kind. Our lives can be truly significant only when we live them out in service, in the care of others; 4) Have faith in God, adding that a truly happy individual is one who, despite unfavorable circumstances, continues to be happy because his happiness is dependent on a set of attitudes which remain unchangeable and unshakable; Every situation should be accepted joyfully, realizing that one cannot change all circumstances; 5) One should develop a strong bond with God.

7. Ms. Julia Morley, Chairperson and Chief Executive, Miss World Organization, England

Priyadarshni Academy's Save the Children Global Award

For her outstanding humanitarian contributions to help children in over a hundred countries lead a better life and for helping multiply her efforts through Miss World Organization's 'Beauty With a Purpose' theme which encourages and enables Miss World contestants to be involved in helping and saving children.

Mrs. Ambani applauded the humanitarian work of the Academy and spoke of Mr. Mukesh Ambani's belief



in the immense potential of India and his own dream of making India big. She added that the Academy's award will inspire him to realize that dream.

Mrs. Birla said she "looks upon the CSR award as



yet another unequivocal recognition of the spirit and culture of giving and caring that our group stands for. I dedicate the award to two of the most important



people who helped us make giant strides to lift the marginalized sections of society from the burden of poverty. She thanked her son, Mr. Kumar Mangalam Birla, for his unflinching support, and her senior team spearheaded by Dr. Pragnya Ram and her 250 foot soldiers spread across geographies for their commitment and passion which has made significant, demonstrable impact on the lives of the underserved of seven million people across 2500 villages in the hinterland of our country."

Dr. Sachs, who was speaking at 7:00 a.m. U.S. time, said, after Dr. Mashelkar received the award on his



behalf, that he could not have had a better wake-up call. He spoke about the world contributions Dr. Mashelkar and Mr. Prabhu have made to development and the inspiration Dr. Fazle provides. He added that he was looking forward to Prime Minister Modi's visit to the U.S. and touched on the agenda he is pursuing to sustain development and the environment.

Dr. Jeffrey Sachs stated that the impending visit of Prime Minister Modi to the U.S. is expected to further Indo-U.S. ties and that India will play a more and more active role in sustaining development in the world.

In her response to the award, Ms. Priyanka Chopra said: "I feel privileged to receive the award and



feel humbled by the presence of the dignitaries on the dais. They have achieved that balance between

being successful and giving back to society. That is something I have always sought to attain myself.

In his acceptance speech, Sir Fazle said that his organization's work has "contributed to the reduction



in child mortality in Bangladesh to less than a fifth, decline in fertility by two-thirds, provided access to finance to more than 8 million poor households, lifted 1.5 million families out of extreme poverty, and quality primary education to over 7 million poor including 70% girls." He added "As the cost of going slow is too high, we are in a hurry to make a difference in other countries in Asia, Africa and the Caribbean".

Ms. Julia Morley said, after receiving the award, "I am honored to accept this award on behalf of all



the young men and women across 140 countries, who make themselves useful in their own country, recognizing that there are so many people who don't have the opportunities that they have."

Ms. Morley's humanitarian work is well known. Ms. Young, the first from Philippines to win the Miss World title, has supported relief and fund raising efforts in several countries for typhoon survivors in the Philippines. She also went to the areas heavily



affected by typhoon and distributed the relief together with the Philippine Red Cross.

Ms. Megan Young, Miss World 2013 from Philippines, Miss Koyal Rana, Miss India World 2014, and Ms.



Poonam Dhillon, former Miss India, adorned the stage. Ms. Young was felicitated by Mr. Suresh Prabhu. Both Ms. Morley and Ms. Young offered to support the efforts of the Academy. Following Mr. Goyal's speech, Ms. Koyal Rana expressed serious interest in participating and doing her best for the Swachh Bharat movement.

Ms. Rana started an NGO called Moksha in Delhi along with her friends when she was 19 and has been



active in teaching cleanliness to school children. She has taken initiatives to intensify her efforts and has shown a keen interest in playing a role in the Swacch Bharat movement. The Academy and its supporters wish her success in her humanitarian work and in winning, come December, the Beauty With A Purpose Miss World title.



Ms. Dhillon has been very active with social causes like drug awareness, AIDS awareness, family




planning and organ donation. She did a show "Save and Empower the Girl Child" with Lilavati Hospital


#### Highlights:
